I. PURPOSE:

To outline responsibilities and activities to support the district's energy conservation policy.

II. DEFINITIONS:

- A. <u>Energy</u>--The energy components covered herein are the natural gas, fuel oil, and electricity used to heat, cool, light, ventilate, and serve appliances in the district buildings.
- B. <u>Energy Audits</u>--An energy audit is a statistical accumulation of the physical and operational characteristics of a building which can be used to determine possible energy-saving projects and procedures.

III. PROCEDURES:

- A. <u>Energy Consumption Data</u>--The director of energy education will monitor the district utility bills and at intervals provide consumption data to the building administrators.
- B. <u>Energy Conservation Guidelines</u>--The director of energy education will publish and distribute guidelines for energy conservation to help each building achieve conservation.
- C. <u>Energy Conservation Committee</u>--The director of central services and facilities planning will chair a district committee which will be charged with monitoring energy conservation activities.

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
